TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

Special emphasis has been placed on training and development in FY77.

Twenty-two managers and employees in senior positions have attended M.D.P. which gives a complete appreciation and understanding of management, particularly management by objectives, performance planning, individual motivation, behavior and development needs, communication and selection.

One "BASICS" program, which develops an understanding of business strategies and decision making processes, especially related to purchasing decisions was presented to six Melbourne and Sydney managers.

Jim Creed has presented one "Counsellor Selling" Program for Sydney staff with six participants. Counsellor Selling is a course which recommends a philosophy of selling. It explains the selling process in terms of Customers' motivation, problem analysis and need satisfaction.

Jim has also conducted two "Customer Contact" programs, one in Sydney and one in Melbourne with 11 participants in the two classes. The program is conducted around Transactional Analysis and concentrates on individual behavior and effective business communication.

Twenty-six have attended the two "Effective Listening" Courses conducted by Jim. This course is designed to help the listener organize what the speaker is saying and extract the key points.

Geoff was the leader for the Supervisory Development Program presented in Melbourne with 12 Melbourne and Sydney supervisors participating. This program emphasises the role of the supervisor in performance planning, interpersonal relations, behavior, communication and selection.

Three Orientation programs have been presented, one in Sydney and two in Melbourne. This program is designed to welcome new employees to the Hewlett-Packard family. Company philosophy and objectives are discussed as well as people, products and HP locations. Benefits Programs and Working conditions are explained in detail and questions from participants are encouraged.

Programs scheduled for the future are:

Counsellor Selling – July – Melbourne, 12 invited. Customer Contact – April – Melbourne, 15 invited. Basics – July – Melbourne – for selected Field Engineers and others.

Management Seminars – Follow-up to M.D.P. – HP Australia Management strategy, planning and accounting – July and August – Melbourne – 12 invitations each program.

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M.D.P. – September – Melbourne – 11 invited. S.D.P. – October – Melbourne (tentative).

FIRST-AID



He is a Graduate of the University of Minnesota and has done Graduate Work at Minnesota and Ucla. He holds Honorary Degrees from the University of Cincinnati, Temple University, and was awarded the Distinguished Achievement Award from the University of Minnesota.




Achievements.

In these times where "after-sales service" appears much more difficult to obtain, it is very refreshing to have dealings with your Company.


